**The Hearse House Restoration** and the development of the Heritage Trail:

With grant funding from the Scottish Government's Place Based Investment Fund the Hearse House in St Mungo's churchyard has been restored. Stonework has been repaired and repointed in a lime mortar. The roof has been re-slated using as many recycled natural slates as possible and structural work has ensured that the walls and roof are stable. New timber boarded doors have been erected with a new timber lintel to match the original.

The interior of the Hearse House has been repaired and an exhibition including 9 display boards installed illustrating aspects of the town's history and heritage together with a feature model of the Clerk Mausoleum. The plan being to use the Hearse House as a focal point for the Heritage Trail.

Work has also been carried out to retore the stone boundary walls to St Mungo's churchyard and the area in front of the Hearse House will be cleared of debris and resurfaced. The cast iron entrance gates and railings will also be repaired.

The development of the Heritage Trail has been carried out by a small group of local people representing the Penicuik Community Development Trust, the Penicuik Arts Association, the Penicuik Historical Society and the Penicuik & District Community Council. The next task is the production of a leaflet and to discuss and agree the management of the Hearse House and the Heritage Trail.

# Continuing public engagement and education work



The Project Support Officer and Archivist have now completed their contracts but aspects of their work continue. The heritage craft workshops are continuing with local community support and the Penicuik Community Development Trust open Saturdays are continuing often with a heritage theme.


The Archivist is coming back for a couple of days in June to give the Penicuik Historical Society some further

# Phase 3 of the Public **Realm Work**

Phase 3 of the public realm work will include repaving the footpaths adjacent to numbers 2-4 The Square in Yorkstone to match earlier phases in the High Street and to provide a granite sett car layby/service area.

The junction of Thornburn Terrace with Bridge street will be resurfaced in new tarmac. This work will be carried out at the end of the summer, once the building work is complete on numbers 2-4 The Square.
